

# WHAT TO BRING

You will be living at camp for three months, so be sure to pack accordingly. It is helpful to use plastic totes, drawers, or crates to store your things. You will be sleeping in a bunk bed, and your storage space will be under and alongside this bed. It is also quite likely that you will move locations several times during the summer, so pack in a way that is easy to unpack/repack as needed. Please feel free to bring some personal items along (books, computer, games, etc.) for your time off; however, realize that any belongings inappropriate for a camper to see or use must be kept in your vehicle during the week. It is hard to describe exactly what living at camp looks like, but it is unique, and you'll need more than you might think. Here is a packing list of essentials. You may look at some items and think, "I don't need that." Trust us...you will.

## CABIN ESSENTIALS

- Pillow, sleeping bag, AND twin sheets
- An extra blanket
- Several bandanas
- Cabin decorations (posters, string lights...)
- Fan
- Plastic 3 drawer storage (most staff find this very helpful! Otherwise bring some other organization for your clothes)
- Personal or floor lamp (optional)
- Age-appropriate devotionals, games, books (optional)

## CLOTHING

- Casual clothing
- Active clothing (including 1 red and 1 blue shirt)
- Sweatshirts and jacket
- Campout clothing (baseball cap, long pants, flannel)
- Clothes that can get dirty/muddy
- 1 or 2 nice outfits
- Modest swimwear (see Summer Staff Procedures)
- Tennis shoes
- Sandals
- Raingear (jacket, boots, umbrella)
- Sunglasses

## OTHER ESSENTIALS

- Passport OR Social Security Card and ID
- Prayer/Support Team 5 or more addresses
- Water bottle
- Shower towel & beach towel
- Shower caddy, soap, shampoo, toothbrush, & toothpaste
- Backpack (for daily items: Bible, water bottle, schedule...)
- Bible, notebook, & pens/pencils
- 1 or 2 flashlights
- Insect repellent and sunscreen
- Laundry detergent
- Snacks for the week (optional)
- Food for weekends
- Camera
- Cabin activities/games for rainy days
- Any musical instruments you play
- Fishing gear (optional)
- Ball/Frisbee (optional)
- Markers (optional: fun for having campers make signs for their bunks!)
